"As a queer female director, it can be difficult to find projects I want to give my time to, let alone something that ignites my passion," the award-winning director said.

"As someone who is pushing 40, who doesn't have their stuff together and feels like they should be far more advanced in every area of life – these characters offer a refreshingly realistic representation of what it's really like to be in your thirties."

The series was created by half-Lebanese writer, actor and mum Tricia-Lyn Morosin who went back to acting school aged 30 but discovered there were few suitable roles for her, so wrote her own.

"I thought, the best way to challenge the lack of diversity on our screens was to create a series that showcased real, wonderfully flawed Aussie women of different shapes, ethnicities and sexual orientations," she said.

The cast also includes Madeline Beukers, Sarah de Possesse, Prudence Holloway and Alison McGirr with Morosin's son and dad also appearing.

Thirty has been nominated at this year's Melbourne WebFest and episodes from Season One are now available.
